Marco Jacquemet (B.A. Università di Bologna; M.A. EHESS, Paris; Ph. D. U.C. Berkeley) is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Communication, University of San Francisco. His current research seeks to assess the communicative mutations resulting from the intersection in the Mediterranean area between mobile people and media idioms. He published three monographs (*Credibility in Court: Communicative Practices in the Camorra's Trials*, Cambridge U.P. 1996; *Il Galateo del Cibernauta*, Castelvevchi 1996; *Ethereal Shadows: Communication and Power in Contemporary Italy*, Autonomedia [forthcoming]) and multiple articles in edited volumes and refereed journals.
